District Committees:

Classmunity (Fundraising website)

We've all had questions regarding charter schools using Classmunity as a fundraising source. I met with Kelly Kloeping (Public Information Officer) and Judy Dilley (District Accountant) to help with clarification and understanding. The following was provided via email.

- *** Do we have to use Classmunity to raise funds?**

No. There is no pressure or expectation for us to use this.

- *** Does a percentage of the money raised *not* go to our site?**

No. We can set up the event so donors have to pay the for the convenience fee. The district is paying the subscription/software to have the tool to do this. Therefore, all proceeds can come directly back to our school.

- ***Does the money raised go to the school district?**

No. When an event is set up on the Classmunity Website, there is a choice as to which account the funds are deposited into. Our AWE account number can be placed here, so the funds can go directly into that account.

- ***If a donor doesn't want to purchase the item, can they still help our school?**

Yes. There is a option available that a person can make a donation in lieu of purchasing an item.

- ***Are any sites currently using Classmunity?**

No. There are a handful of teachers testing it out across the district. However, there isn't a site using Classmunity as a sole fundraising source.
